bore

He bored two holes in the wood for the two screws to go into.



CRE

bore

to create (an opening such as a tunnel) by cutting through

They bored a big tunnel between the UK and France, so that trains could transport passengers between the two countries.

to create or force (an opening or passage).

bore

to weary with repetition, monotony, or dullness

I won't bore you with the details.





bore

a person whose talk or behavior is dull and uninteresting

bore

tidal water that rises abruptly to form a wave as it moves inland

Bores occur in relatively few locations worldwide, usually in areas with a large tidal range.







spring

a flow of water from the earth

My grandfather collects water from a spring in the mountains.

a season of the year between winter and summer

having to do with or taking place during the season of spring

The night air of spring was chilly in the mountains.



spring

used for the season of spring

I need a thinner jacket for spring.



squash

to press, beat, or crush into a flat mass

I stepped on the flower and squashed it by mistake.

squash

to be pressed or crushed into a flat mass

The flower was squashed between the pages in the book.



squash

to press or squeeze into a tight space

The morning commute was busy and we were all squashed together on the train.



squash

a fruit that grows on a vine and is eaten as a vegetable. Squash grows in many sizes, colors, and shapes

Butternut squash soup is my favorite soup.



squash

a racquet sport played by two players in a four-walled court with a small, hollow rubber ball

My parents enjoy playing squash.

stable

fixed, firm, or steady in position; not shaky or easily moved

Please keep the ladder stable.



stable

not easily changed; lasting a long time

Food prices are stable these days.





stable

a building where animals such as horses or cows are kept and fed. Stables are often divided into separate stalls

He mucks out the stable almost every day.



steer

to cause to move in a certain direction

I steered my bike up the ramp.

steer

to direct or guide toward a course of action

My parents steer me in the right direction.



CRE

steer

to be able to be steered

My bike doesn't steer well.



RE

steer

a young bull or male ox that is not able to produce young and that is raised for beef

My uncle has cows and steer on his ranch.



KE

stern

firm and determined; not flexible

My grandmother is stern with my mother.

stern

grim or strict

The mother gave her child a stern look.



stern



the rear or back part of a boat or other vessel

I sat in the stern of the canoe and steered, while my brother paddled in front.



stoop

to bend the body forward and downward, as to pick up something

I stooped to pick up the toddler.



stoop

to stand or walk with shoulders and neck hanging forward

If you stoop too much, you will hurt your back.

stoop

to perform a task or act that lowers oneself or is not honest and upright

She will never stoop to stealing.



PKE

stoop

a large step or small porch at the entrance to a home, often reached by a short flight of steps

When I got home my sister was sitting on the stoop in front of our house.

store

a place where things are sold

Can you go to the store for some milk, please?



store

a supply kept or saved for future use

He stores his books under his bed.

store

a large amount; plenty

There is a store of talent in our choir.



store

to gather and keep for future use

We stored away our T-shirts and shorts for next summer.



train

a connected series of railroad cars

The train is pulling into the station.



RE

train

a long, moving line of persons, animals, or vehicles

The train of hikers made it to the summit of the mountain.

train

a series of things or ideas

Sorry, I just lost my train of thought.





train

the long part of a gown or robe that trails behind the person wearing it

The train on that wedding dress is five meters long.





train

to teach skills or actions

We need to train our dog to heel and sit.



train

to instruct

The tennis players are trained by a Wimbledon champion.

train

to make fit through a program of exercise and diet

The coach trained him for the tournament.





train

to cause to take a particular shape or form

I can't seem to train my hair to curl.





train

to prepare oneself to be in an athletic contest

He trained for years to get to the Olympics.





trunk

the main stem of a tree

Nail the notice on the trunk of that tree.

trunk

the body of a human or animal, not including the head, neck, arms, and legs

He waded into the water up to his trunk.



KE

trunk

a large, strong container, often with a lock, used to store or transport goods; chest

She opened the trunk and found it empty.



RE

trunk

a large compartment in the rear of an automobile used to store items such as packages and tools

He put his bags in the trunk, then hopped in the car and drove off.

the long snout of an elephant. An elephant uses its flexible trunk to

trunk

breathe, feed itself and pick up objects

The elephant picked up the bar

The elephant picked up the banana with his trunk.

trunk

(plural) a pair of short pants worn in sports such as track, men's swimming, and boxing

The boxer is wearing blue trunks.



KE

watch

to look closely or carefully

He watched the basketball game with great interest.



RE

watch

to look or wait in anticipation (usually followed by "for")

Watch for our new music video.



watch

to be careful

Watch that you don't hurt yourself when you go skating.





Flashcards

watch

to look at closely or with continued attention

We cozied up on the sofa to watch a movie.



RE

watch

to guard or tend attentively

The mother is watching over her kids in the playground.



KE

watch

an act or a period of staying awake

He took the first watch to guard the camp.



watch

the act of guarding or protecting

She kept a close watch on her brother.





Flashcards

watch

a small device for measuring and showing the time, often worn on the wrist

My sister just received her first watch as she's learning to tell time.



yard

a unit of length equal to three feet or 0.9144 meters

My sister bought five yards of cloth.



yard

a long rod fastened across the mast of a ship to hold a sail

Make sure the yard isn't damaged before we leave the harbor.



yard

an open area next to a house or other building

The kids are playing on the school yard during recess.
