Reading Comprehension Worksheet

Practice

A parent or tutor should read to the student and help the student to record their answers.

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A **sequence** is what happens *first*, *next*, and *last*.

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Here are some examples. Write the number 1 in the box beside what happened *first*. Write the number 2 in the box beside what happens *next*. Write the number 3 in the box beside what happens *last*.

1. What happened *first*, *next*, and *last*? 1, 2, or 3?

Theresa's teacher said the butterfly was pretty.	
Theresa gave her picture to her teacher.	
Theresa drew a picture of a butterfly.	

2. What happened *first*, *next*, and *last*?

1, 2, or 3?

Jenna watched the squirrels play in the park.	
Jenna's mom took her to the park.	
At home, Jenna drew a picture of the squirrels.	

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3. Draw 3 pictures to show the **sequence** of Jenna's day. What happened *first*, *next*, and *last*?
