Kindergarten Reading Worksheet



When we **compare** two things, we tell how they are **alike**. When we **contrast** two things, we tell how they are **different**.

1. Read or listen to the story. As you do, think about how Mae and her sister are <u>alike</u> and <u>different</u>.

Mae and her sister, Kara, look like twins. They both have brown hair, brown eyes and wear glasses! They also both love the color purple.

Mae loves to wear a purple cowgirl hat.

Kara always wears a purple sweatshirt.

Sisters aren't always exactly the same, though!

quiet and likes to watch what is going on around her.

She loves to curl up on the couch and read. Kara
doesn't really like to read. She would
rather be with her friends! She likes to
tell jokes and make her friends laugh.
