

Answers

- $5 \text{ L } 600 \text{ ml} + 1 \text{ L } 100 \text{ ml} + 2 \text{ L } 200 \text{ ml} = 8 \text{ L } 900 \text{ ml}$
 $8 \text{ L } 900 \text{ ml} - 5 \text{ L } 600 \text{ ml} = 3 \text{ L } 300 \text{ ml}$
There were 3 L 300ml of pineapple juice left.
- $4 \times 5 \text{ ml} = 20 \text{ ml}$
He would take 20 ml of his syrup daily.
 $20 \text{ ml} \times 7 = 140 \text{ ml}$
He would take 140 ml of his medicine in a week.
- $128 \text{ L} - 63 \text{ L} = 65 \text{ L}$
 $65 \div 5 = 13$
The farmer will have 13 containers of milk.
- $60.5 \text{ L} - 43.8 \text{ L} = 16.7 \text{ L} = 16 \text{ L } 700 \text{ ml}$
There were 16 L 700 ml of petrol in the tank before refilling.
- $4 \text{ L} = 4,000 \text{ ml}$
 $4,000 - 2,580 = 1,420 \text{ ml} = 1 \text{ L } 420 \text{ ml}$
There is 1 L 420 ml of white paint left in the container.
- $350 \times 4 = 1,400$
 $1,400 - 1,200 = 200 \text{ ml}$
The 4 boxes of juice have 200 ml more than a bottle of juice.
