Drawing conclusions means figuring something out for yourself. To draw conclusions, you need to think about <u>what makes the most sense</u>.

Here are some examples of things you can figure out for yourself. Put an **X** in the box for the **conclusion** that *makes the most sense*.

1.	Paulina took her homework and a pencil out of her
	backpack. This probably means that:
