

Drawing conclusions

Grade 1 Comprehension Worksheet



Drawing conclusions means figuring something out for yourself. To draw conclusions, you need to think about <u>what makes the most sense</u>.

Here are some examples of things you can figure out for yourself. Put an **X** in the box for the **conclusion** that *makes the most sense*.

1. Mrs. Martin opened her schoolbag and took out her students' papers.

This probably means that:



Mrs. Martin is a lawyer.



Mrs. Martin is a teacher.

 The firefighters jumped on the firetruck, and the driver turned on the siren as the firetruck left the station.

Chris is going to make a sandwich.



Chris is going to make a pizza.

6. Benji's dad looked at the broken gate for a while, and then went to the garage to get a hammer and some nails.

This probably means that:
